## CARROWDORE ROAD RACE

#### EVENT SUMMARY

The Carrowdore Road Race follows the route of the old Carrowdore 100 motor bike circuit. It starts on Main Street, close to the petrol station in the centre of Carrowdore. It follows Main Street south west into Manse Road. At the end it turns left at Ballyboley Corner on to Cardy Road. It follows this road straight on to Cardy Road East, and on to Dunover Road, before turning left in to Dunover Road North. At the end, it turns left on to New Road, and at the end it turns left on to Main Street, to complete the lap.

This lap is approximately 5.3 miles. Club races are normally 5 laps, and races are handicapped.

# ELIGIBILITY

Event open to cyclists with Cycling Ireland, Full or limited competition licence only. Participants must show CI Licence at sign on.

# MARSHAL / OFFICIAL LOCATIONS

Start line / Finish line x2 Timekeepers Ballyboley Corner x 3 Dunover Road / Dunover Road North corner x 2 Dunover Road North / New Road corner x 2 New Toad / Main Street Corner x 3

HAZARDS/RISKS - The following hazards have been identified

- 1. The event will take place on open roads, thus there will be other traffic using the course.
- 2. Be aware of traffic in start / finish area due to Spar / garage and village traffic exiting from side roads.
- The road surface (start line to Ballyboley corner section) is in bad state of repair in parts. Riders should exercise caution and warn other riders of hazards.

**CONTROL MEASURES** - To mitigate against the above hazards / risks the following control measures will be adopted.

- The race will be capped at 60 riders maximum, all of whom may be expected to have significant experience of this type event, on similar roads. Riders will be warned at the start to remain on the LHS of road at all times and reminded that marshals are not empowered to stop traffic.
- 2. Race entry is handicapped and split into 3 groups to make smaller bunches on the road.
- 3. The event is scheduled to start on a Tuesday evening, when it is expected that traffic levels are low.
- 4. Signs indicating that a cycle event is in progress will be posted along the course at various points.
- Marshals will be present at the corners and at the start / finish area. A time-keeper will be posted at the start-finish area.
- All marshals associated with the event will wear high visibility vests.
- 7. The event will be run under Cycling Irelands rules.
- 8. In the event of severe weather conditions the event will be shortened, postponed or cancelled.
